Visits may last between 10 -30 minutes, starting on the hour or half hour. CLOSED ON HOLIDAYS

Prisoners may be moved at any time to a different housing unit or denied visiting because of disciplinary problems.

Visitors who are Probationers or Parolees, Convicted Felons, Former Employees, Former jail inmates, or persons who violate jail visiting rules and regulations will be denied visiting privileges.

No one under 18 years of age will be allowed to visit except the child, step child, sibling, or grandchild of the prisoner. A birth certificate or proof of legal guardianship must be presented by the visitor at the time of visitation. Juveniles must be accompanied by their legal guardian at all times.

Visitors will not be allowed if dressed in suggestive or revealing apparel. No sexual or provocative behavior.

Visitors may deposit cash, money order or cashier's check in the prisoners commissary account during visiting.

When sending a letter into the facility, you must have your name and return address on the envelope.

To address a letter to a prisoner, you must put the prisoners name and SO#, Summit County Jail and the address. See example:

NO CAMERA PHONES IN VISITING

All incoming and outgoing mail is scanned. Letters that threaten the security of the facility, prisoners, criminal content, or of suspicious nature will be seized, investigated and is subject to prosecution.

Incoming mail that has the following items will not be delivered to the prisoner:
Cash/personal or business checks/ Stickers/Musical cards/Sexually oriented material/Postage stamps/Drugs/Bodily fluids/perfume/internet downloads. Incoming mail that contains the above listed items will be placed in the inmates locker.

Inmates can send email letters through eNotes. You are allowed to reply through their link. No forwards or attachments. Follow the directions when prompted.

You may obtain the SO# from this pamphlet or from the prisoner during your visit.

The jail will only accept soft bound books from the publisher (book store).

Publishers only rule.

The jail will accept money orders or cashier checks through the mail.

Prisoners have telephone access between 6:30 am and 10:30 pm. All calls are initiated by the prisoner.

Phone time can be purchased through the commissary account by the inmate, or collect calls may be made during regular operating hours.

The prisoner telephone system is subject to monitoring and recording at anytime.

The jail will not accept messages for a prisoner. The jail does not give messages to prisoners. The ONLY exception would be a medical emergency or Death Notification. If you manipulate the message exception rule, the prisoner will be
